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Missouri's Premiere Downtown Revitalization Conference: Evening of Excellence Awards Ceremony & Dinner Awards - 2025

Branson, MO. – Missouri Main Street Connection (MMSC) presented 23 awards during Missouri's Premier Downtown Revitalization Conference's Evening of Excellence Awards Ceremony and Dinner at the St. Charles Convention Center to communities, individuals, businesses, and organizations from across the state that completed exemplary work in downtown revitalization.

Missouri Main Street Connection Awarded the Best Downtown Housing Project Award to Joplin Commons for the Pennington Drug Company Rehabilitation Project

Joplin Commons received the award for their multi-year rehabilitation that transformed the formerly abandoned Pennington Drug Company building into the Pennington Lofts. This project retrofitted a 40,000 sq.ft., 1919 warehouse into a mixed-use development that offers twenty-one apartments and three commercial spaces in the heart of downtown Joplin, which was no easy feat. Joplin Commons overcame challenge after challenge including the COVID-19 pandemic, economic disruptions, and budget increases with the help of historic tax credits, historic tax credit bridge loan, Federal Tax Credit investor, Missouri Chapter 353 property tax abatement through the City of Joplin, and strong community support.

As a result of the rehabilitation, Downtown Joplin now has a one-of-a-kind industrial apartment option that rivals the lofts of New York with sky-bridges providing balconies for tenants, a 50-foot-long mural highlighting the climate-friendly act of building renovations and the inherent beauty of change, and much more.

The Pennington Drug Company Rehabilitation is more than just a housing project; it is a brilliant example of the economic and environmental impact of preserving history and building community. Lori Haun, Executive Director of Downtown Joplin Alliance, stated, "The Pennington Drug Company rehabilitation is truly an example of giving a 100-year-old building a better next century!"

Missouri Main Street Connection Awarded the Best Façade Rehabilitation Award to Maryville Florist

The building, located in the heart of Downtown Maryville, is a historic building that was constructed in the 1880's and housed a range of businesses over the decades, including a dry goods store, dry cleaner, and children's clothing boutique before becoming the long-standing home of Maryville Florists.

In 2024, the current owners completed improvements that focused on restoring the building's historic details and improved the long-term structural integrity. Following improvements, Maryville Florist adds to the vibrancy of Downtown Maryville with a refreshed awning, clean façade, and mural. Maryville Florist have also reported an improvement in business visibility and customer engagement.

The project has inspired neighboring property owners to consider physical improvements on their buildings causing a ripple effect that will inevitably strengthen Downtown Maryville. DeAnn Davison, Executive Director of Downtown Maryville, stated, "It's a striking, cheerful introduction to the historic district and a model on how strategic restoration can impact a business bottom line and Maryville's downtown identity."

The Maryville Florist is a shining example of how preservation-based economic development generates a higher return on investment through preserving history, supporting small businesses, and energizing a community.

Missouri Main Street Connection Awarded the Best Historic Preservation Project Award to the Buckner-Ragsdale Event Center

The Buckner-Ragsdale building on Broadway in Cape Girardeau was redeveloped and returned to serve the local community as the Buckner-Ragsdale Event Center by new owners in 2024. As an event center with affiliations to the downtown Marriott Courtyard Hotel, it continues an almost 100-year legacy of being a place that people gather to form memorable experiences like its former roles as the Buckner-Ragsdale department store or Buckner Brewing.

Following the \$4.5 million redevelopment, this former underutilized, vacant, "white elephant" building now houses four event spaces including a large ballroom on the main floor with open floors and a stage for live entertainment, a second-floor loft with exposed brick walls and an amazing river view, a downstairs cellar space with stone walls, and a smaller, more intimate boardroom. This transformation returns the property to its former glory as a prominent, eye-catching, first impression to visitors and locals who enter the downtown Riverfront district.

This project was completed by utilizing local businesses in the building's redevelopment, in accordance with the Secretary of Interior's Standards and funded, in part, by both state and federal historic rehabilitation tax credits.

The Buckner-Ragsdale Event Center project brilliantly demonstrates the impact of locally-led and operated historic preservation-based economic development, which prioritizes thinking outside the box to create new uses for old spaces and bringing people together to reenergize and revitalize downtown.

Missouri Main Street Connection Awarded the Best New Awareness Campaign, Accredited Tier Award to Historic Downtown Liberty

HLDI received this award for their Branding Campaign was a profound collaboration between their Promotion, Design, and Organization teams to create and unveil a new visual identity that was incorporated into their physical and digital presence as well as programs and initiatives that engaged long-time residents, newcomers, and visitors.

The branding campaign updated key visuals with modern design trends and seamlessly blends with the established visuals that laid a strong foundation for continued growth. It also was accompanied by a website redesign, incentive programs such as "Fun Money" and gift cards, promotional rack cards, new event artwork and signage, banners, and a new open flag program.

HDLI's new "open flag" program is one enhancement to specifically call out as it provided businesses with high-quality flags to display outside their storefronts, clearly indicating when they are open. Danelle O'Connell, Executive Director of HDLI, stated "This simple, yet effective program, not only increases foot traffic but also contributes to a more welcoming and cohesive atmosphere throughout the district."

HDLI received the Best New Awareness Campaign award for its blending of modern design with time-tested promotional tactics to bring new vibrancy to Downtown Liberty, which is an example to all Main Street programs on the impact that refreshing a Main Street's visual identity and executing targeted promotional strategies can have on foot traffic and engagement.

Missouri Main Street Connection Awarded the Best New Awareness Campaign, Affiliate Tier Award to Stanberry Main Street

Stanberry Main Street received this award for their Annual Giving Campaign that exceeded their goal of raising \$25,000. The money raised will fund Facade Improvement Grants for local downtown businesses and shows the community's enthusiastic support of downtown revitalization efforts.

Stanberry Main Street kicked off this fundraising campaign on July 4, 2024, during Stanberry's longest-standing tradition, the Fourth of July celebration. Over the course of three short months, they raised \$27,000 to support continued economic growth, community participation, and increased pride in their town through donations big and small. The grand announcement of their success came from Organization Co-Chair Megan Jennings at their Street Lights and Small Town Nights event.

They exceeded their goal in fundraising through a multi-channel approach that included a signature and creative element to their promotional campaign, which was the opportunity to donate \$18.79, a tribute to the year Stanberry was founded. Terri Johnson, Project Director for Stanberry Main Street, stated "This historically symbolic donation option captured hearts and added a unique storytelling aspect to our appeal." Additionally, Stanbery Main Street volunteers reached people through personalized letters, news articles, social media posts, participated in parades, and manned a booth at their tent during their Fourth of July celebration.

Delmar Main Streets received this award for the expansion of their Commemorative 15th Annual Sista Strut Walk and Parade that celebrates the resilience of black women facing breast cancer and raises awareness about early detection and support resources for Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

In 2024, this event expanded down the Delmar corridor and into the afternoon with multiple activation sites in the Delmar Maker District and the East Loop Commercial Improvement District (CID) following the morning walk that blended health awareness, arts, culture, and economic activation into one unforgettable experience.

The event saw over 10,000 participants visiting curated sites along the safe, coordinated, route that included: The Moonrise Hotel rooftop for a celebratory post-walk reception; Prime 55 for "Think Pink" brunch specials; survivor recognition; and The Fountain, Steve's Hot Dogs, and Alpha Brewing for a day-long free Zumba marathon that concluded with an ice cream finale at The Fountain.

Delmar Main Streets accomplished this through a variety of collaborations and partnerships that included iHeart Media, Sista Strut Organizers, Shirley Bradley LeFlore Foundation's Kranzberg Arts Fellow, Siteman Cancer Center, and more.

The Commemorative 15th Annual Sista Strut Walk and Parade deserves the Creative New Promotion, Associate Tier Award because of its impactful expression that spans and links multiple areas withing a larger district that fostered economic activity, promoted health, and promoted community connectivity.

Stanberry Main Street received this award for their *Street Lights and Small Town Nights* that was a landmark event that united residents and visitors in celebration of small-town charm, highlighted local business support, and shared purpose.

Promoted as a project implemented by the Promotion Committee of Stanberry Main Street, this new promotional experience attracted people downtown for fun including a performance by "Railway," a well-known local band; socializing where ages 21 to 80 mingled under a canopy of string lights; and financial support of Stanberry Main Street's revitalization efforts, which totaled \$23,000 in gross ticket sales from over 300 tickets sold.

As a newer Main Street program, the success of *Street Lights and Small Town Nights* gave the program credibility as an organization that has the capacity to plan, promote, and host a high-quality event that truly served the community. Stanberry Main Street Board President shared, "We didn't just talk about revitalization—we made it real. We created a night where everyone felt proud to be part of Stanberry."

Missouri Main Street Connection Awarded the Main Street Business Recruitment, Accredited Tier Award to Old Town Cape

Old Town Cape received this award for their ongoing Main Street Business Recruitment efforts that have revitalized downtown Cape Girardeau, which is a large downtown district with 130 blocks consisting of multiple commercial areas at various stages of revitalization. They accomplished this by successfully recruiting businesses to the district, helping to revitalize vacant properties, create jobs, and foster increased foot traffic throughout the area.

Downtown Cape Girardeau's vacancy rate across its large district is down to 20% and is a product of Old Town Cape's strategic approach to business recruitment, commitment to fostering a vibrant downtown, and collaboration with local leaders, business owners, and the community. One component of their strategic approach is their **Vacancy to Vibrancy** open houses. Old Town Cape reports that they average close to 100 attendees each year for the **Vacancy to Vibrancy** event with about 50% of participating properties being leased or sold within a year following the event.

On top of a low vacancy rate, Liz Haynes, Executive Director of Old Town Cape, shares the steps behind securing the right downtown tenant, "it's about fostering long-term growth and community engagement. Our recruitment plan includes personalized, high-touch outreach to prospective business owners including a district driving tour."

Old Town Cape deserves the Main Street Business Recruitment, Accredited Tier Award for their years of success in business recruitment, which stems from strong support from their community



and a comprehensive, data driven strategy.

Missouri Main Street Connection Awarded the Main Street Business Recruitment Associate Tier Award to Danny and April True for The 229 Project.

Danny and April True, two local entrepreneurs and community leaders, received this award for fostering economic vitality through innovation, partnership, and people-first development. They created the 229 Project, in partnership with Lebanon Missouri Main Street, as a business incubator and life-changing package that provides a physical space, tools, mentorship, and momentum to one selected entrepreneur.

The 229 Project revealed that Downtown Lebanon is full of entrepreneurial potential with 67 applications from business owners.

The project team selected Carmen's, a locally owned deli and bakery, following their submitted business plans and pitch presentations. The entrepreneur behind Carmen's received six months of free rent, six additional months of reduced rent, and a three-year lease in The 229 Project, a renovated 2,500-square-foot storefront. Carmen's also received a fifteen-thousand-dollar remodel budget and mentorship from a hand-selected team of local professionals.

The runner up, Snickelfritz Boutique, a scrapbook and craft store, decided to also open a storefront in Downtown Lebanon after being inspired by the experience. This means that The 229 Project successfully recruited two new small businesses to the district.

The 229 Project is an outstanding accomplishment and an example of how partnerships and vision bring transformational business recruitment to life with community-wide impact.

Missouri Main Street Connection Awarded the Outstanding Economic Impact Project Accredited Tier Award to Downtown Excelsior Partnership, Inc.

Downtown Excelsior Partnership, Inc. (DEP) received this award for their Annual Report Campaign titled, "The Numbers. The Impact. The Future." that boldly raised public awareness of their measurable success, fiscal stewardship, and impact.

The annual report was shared through a comprehensive, multi-platform strategy including a printed and digital report, a formal presentation to City Council, and a powerful email campaign delivered to local investors, stakeholders, and partners. In this report, DEP showcased their 2024 data which was collected via Placer.ai. The data included over 350,000 visits, representing a 1.62% increase, and a 7.8% increase in sales tax revenue, which is a direct reflection of successful marketing.

It is one thing to have an outstanding economic impact as an organization, but it is another thing to package that impact into an engaging and accessible format to drive continued engagement, financial support, and foot traffic. As a result of Downtown Excelsior Partnership's Annual Report Campaign, they strengthened their relationships with the City of Excelsior Springs, business owners, volunteers, and donors.

The Downtown Excelsior Partnership's Annual Report Campaign titled, "The Numbers. The Impact. The Future." is a successful campaign that other Main Streets can look to as an example for how their organization can offer their community a retrospective and a rallying cry.

Danni Eickenhorst, Steve Ewing, and Derrick Langeneckert received this award for their transformative partnership that brought over \$1 million in new investment and development to the Delmar Maker District.

These three entrepreneurs invested in a new construction project, Delmar Makers Locale, to house The Fountain, Steve's Hot Dogs, and Alpha Brewing Company. It also includes a multi-use space equipped with a welcoming indoor/outdoor shared patio, beer garden, and an all-season astro-turf pocket park featuring life-sized games and family-friendly amenities in a dynamic destination that blends food, music, craft beer, and community gathering into a powerful engine for economic vitality and cultural enrichment in St. Louis. It also deeply enhances the quality of life in the Delmar district.

Since opening, this team has solidified the block as a "go next" neighborhood destination, driving new visitors, repeat customers, and additional investment. This project is a powerful anchor for the Delmar Main Street district and marks the pivotal moment in this district and neighborhood's growth as one of 12 new restaurants that opened in 2024.

Danni Eickenhorst, Steve Ewing, and Derrick Langeneckert are deserving of the Outstanding Economic Impact Project Associate Tier Award for their leadership in the transformation of a once-vacant lot into a vibrant hub where neighbors and visitors alike can taste, see, shop, eat, and play.

They have formed over 10 partnerships that include the City of West Plains, Ozark Radio News, Ozarks Small Business Incubator, Council on the Arts, National Association of REALTORS®, and more.

They have had an outstanding impact on their community with the clear vision they established through the Community Empowerment Grant, leading to initiatives like a National Trust for Historic Preservation Coloring Book, real estate tours, alley activation, First Thursday Strolls, wayfinding, beautification, downtown cleanups, Sounds Downtown, and more.

For the Burg Fest Street Fair, over 50 athletes showed up ready to work from teams including UCM Mules Basketball, UCM Jennies Basketball, UCM Wrestling, and the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. These students were vital in moving over 100 fence panels, erecting multiple festival tents and organizing our office with enthusiasm that reduced the time to complete tasks from several hours to under an hour.

Following setting up the festival, students returned over the course of the weekend to help with other tasks including emptying over 60 rolling trash cans into the dumpsters.

The University of Central Missouri's (UCM) Athletic Department and its students deserve to receive the Premier Partner, Accredited Tier Award for the college's encouragement of community support specifically to Warrensburg Main Street and the students commitment to their community, character, and commitment to excellence.

Missouri Main Street Connection Awarded the Small Scale Placemaking Activity, Accredited Tier Award to Old Town Cape

Old Town Cape received this award for their Community Garden, which is the perfect intersection of Cape Girardeau's identity as a vibrant center of community engagement and sustainable urban revitalization, the spirit of Main Street, innovative placemaking, environmental stewardship, and downtown activation.

Once an unused greenspace, Old Town Cape's Community Garden has become a community treasure in the two years since it was created. A variety of partnerships strengthened the garden including those with local businesses, Master Gardeners from the University of Missouri's Extension office, neighborhood volunteers, Rotary Clubs, and local farmers.

This welcoming, 1,000-square-foot herb garden supports community connectivity and small businesses as a gathering place for programming and connections while also producing an incredible amount of fresh herbs for nine months out of the year that are donated to local food banks, harvested by chefs at downtown restaurants, utilized by farmers market vendors as well as dried, labeled, and packaged for donation.

Old Town Cape hosts monthly community workdays during the market season where everyone can participate in seasonal garden activities fostering cross-generational connections as seniors share gardening knowledge with younger participants.

The Old Town Cape Community Garden is a model for creative, impactful placemaking that strengthens downtown's identity, builds meaningful connections, and measurably enhances the Main Street district's vitality.

Missouri Main Street Connection Awarded the Small Scale Placemaking Activity, Affiliate Level Award to Main Street Albany

Main Street Albany received this award for their Campbell Park project, the newest, temporary gathering place in Albany. This project brought to life a property following the demolition of a 1900's post office on their downtown courthouse square.

In partnership with the City of Albany, Main Street Albany's design committee and board of directors developed a plan to utilize the empty lot with removable fixtures that immediately activated the space while providing flexibility when they found a developer to reimagine the property. With the Smith Street Park across the street the committee landed on a temporary gathering space for the community that would increase the visual attractiveness of downtown while also expanding the useable area during their farmers market and other downtown events.

Since its completion in June of 2024, Campbell Park has contributed to the Albany Square Farmers Market season and Albany's annual music festival "Rhythm 'N' Roots Festival". Main Street Albany included amenities in the park such as sun sails, outdoor furniture items, and landscaping elements including wood mulch, flowers, and more. This was all accomplished through support from the city, local businesses, and community members who contributed time, equipment, items, and financial support.
